Or do you think lightly of the riches of His kindness and tolerance and patience, not knowing that the kindness of God leads you to repentance?

Ro 2:4

... the Greek word translated "patience" ... refers specifically to patience with people. It literally means "to be long-tempered," and it speaks of one who could easily retaliate when wronged but chooses not to. That kind of patience is a spiritual virtue reflective of God Himself (cf. Gal. 5:22). It can't be duplicated on a purely human level. But for Christians, it's to be a way of life.

He will not use a flood to bring destruction on the earth or men.


Despite the depravity of man, his constant love for and orientation to sin God will extend grace, mercy, and patience
